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B. GRANT INFORMATION

The TEACH Grant Program provides grants of up to \$4,000* a year to FAFSA filers who are completing or plan to complete a program (e.g. [TEP](#)) needed to begin a career in teaching. As a condition for receiving a TEACH Grant, you must abide by the obligations listed in the [TEACH Grant Counseling and Agreement to Serve \(ATS\)](#), some of which are agreeing to teach:

- in a high-need field;
- at an elementary school, secondary school, or educational service agency that serves students from low-income families; and
- for at least four complete academic years within eight years after completing (or ceasing enrollment in) the course of study for which you received the grant

*For any **2020-2021 (summer 2021)** TEACH Grant disbursed on or after Oct. 1, 2020, and before Oct. 1, 2021, the maximum award of \$4,000 is reduced by 5.7% (\$228), resulting in a maximum award of \$3,772. However, because summer 2021 is only one quarter, the maximum summer award is up to **\$1,257**

*For any **2021-2022 (fall 2021, winter 2022, and spring 2022)** TEACH Grant first disbursed on or after Oct. 1, 2021, and before Oct. 1, 2022, the maximum award of \$4,000 is reduced by 5.7% (\$228), resulting in a maximum award of **\$3,772** (i.e. \$1,257 per quarter)

C. INITIAL ELIGIBILITY

- Meet academic achievement requirements such as scoring above the 75th percentile on one or more portions of a college admissions test (e.g. GRE) **or** have an undergraduate cumulative GPA of at least 3.25
- Complete the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 [FAFSA](#) and have all required documents submitted to our office (if any)
 - If you are/were an undergraduate student for the 2020-2021 academic year, you will need to update your 2020-2021 FAFSA: college grade level = 1st year graduate/professional, college degree/certificate = graduate/professional degree, already have first bachelor's degree = yes, and working on a master's or doctorate = yes
- Complete the [TEACH Grant Counseling and Agreement to Serve \(ATS\)](#) that explains the terms and conditions of the TEACH Grant service obligations. You must complete both each year in which you will receive the grant (e.g. 2020-2021 and 2021-2022)

D. CONDITIONS OF SERVICE OBLIGATION

If you do not meet the requirements of your service obligation, all TEACH Grant funds you received will be converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan. In exchange for receiving a TEACH Grant, you must agree to the following:

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 throughout the teaching program (e.g. TEP)
- Fulfill the terms of the TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS)
- Complete the [TEACH Grant Exit Counseling](#) upon graduating from or withdrawing from the teaching program
- Serve as a full-time teacher for a total of at least four academic years within eight years after you complete or otherwise cease to be enrolled in the program for which you received the TEACH Grant
- Perform the teaching service as a highly qualified teacher in a high-need field at a low-income school or educational service agency
- Provide the Department of Education with documentation of your progress toward completing your service obligation

E. STUDENT CERTIFICATION

I understand that the TEACH Grant program has specific service obligations that must be met in order for the award to remain as a grant. If I fail to meet all the conditions of the TEACH Grant or if the conditions are not documented as required, I understand that the award will be permanently converted to an Unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loan and I will be responsible for repaying this loan with interest calculated from the disbursement date of the grant. I understand that once a TEACH Grant is converted to a loan; it cannot be converted back to a grant.
